

But 100,000 Pounds More to Be Received .-- Rostly Cody, Custer and Park City Clips,

SOME CLIPS WITHDRAWN

Phis Is in Case Where Price Bid Was Below 16 Cents .- Price Paid Ranges from 16 to 1812 .- All the Larger Clips Rave Now Been Sold.

All of the 6,000,000 odd pounds received at the Northern Facric wave-house during a good senson, has an-ready arrived with the exception of a sc. nc 100,000 pounds, most of which is in the neighborhood of Cody, Cus-ter and Park City.

Just 2,000,000 pounds more remain to be shipped. Some of the clips put up at public sale were withdrawn, when the price bid did not reach 16

ents.
Prices during the last two days

ranged from 16 to 18½ cents and several hundred thousand pounds were disposed of at about 16 cents.

The Shupek clip was sold to Jeremiah Williams. This wool amounted to about 80,000 pounds.

The Weirich clip of 100,000 pounds was purchased at Koshiand.

Silberman and Sons bought in the John C. Tintinger clip of 60,000 pounds, the J. S. Tebbs elip of 15,000 pounds and the J. W. Hoffman clip of 10,000 pounds.

Hecht. Liberman company also bought up the following wood: H. I. R. Sheep company clip of 30,000, Mc-Kay Bros. wool of 40,000, A. L. H Titson of 20,009, E. Rogness of 20,009 and the Miller Bros. of 60,000 pounds.

The season is rapidly drawing to a close and all the large wool clips have now been disposed of.

MAN CHARGED WITH MURDER

Wyoming Sheriff and Chief Talgo Take Into Castedy Man Wanted in Sheridan.

Only to Die a Few Days Later,-Wifeo f Alleged Murderer Gives the Sheriff Information.

On a charge of murder in the first degree, Mike E. Lazar of Monarch, Wyo., was arrested in this city yesterday and taken to Sheridan, where he will be held to answer the charge. The killing occurred last Thosday night in a tent saloon at Monarch and the victim was Steve Karpe. Both men are Hungarians, and it is stated that the trouble between the two men fraced back to the time when they lived in the mother country.

Both men were working in the mines at Carneyville and met in the saloon at Monarch A quarrel ensued. Just what passed between the two men is not known. But at the end of the row, Karpe was disemboweled by his opponent's knife, it is stated. The further allegations are that Lazar buried his victim allve in a pile of cindors nearby, and that Karpe's pittful groons attracted attention and he was removed and hurried to a hospital. The victim lingered until Frid'y, when he died. Although conscious part of the time he refused to talk about the case. bout the case.

Lazar then took leave of his wife and colldren, telling them where he was going but warning them not to give him away, under peril of death.

It was understood that Sheriff Benefiel learned from the wife that Lazar had come to Billings. Also it is blooght that Lazar is wanted for inisdeeds in the old country.

By means of a letter addressed to his wife from a restaurant in this city telling her to meet him here, and which letter fell into the sheriff's hands, the latter was enabled to trace his man to this city.

He answered the letter himself, could the train for Billings, met Chief Talgo, and accompanied by the latter went in a local restaurant, where they caw a Hene rion take the letter. This man was cornered and made to lead the way to Lazar who was then apprehended and taken to jail.

Lazar admitted the killing, but says the other man was the aggressor.
