

Transcontinental freight run cut almost 1/3

saving shippers one full day on freight to & from Chicago and the Pacific Northwest

One day's savings in time means one day's savings in inventories for shippers using The Milwaukee Road's fast freight trains: the XL SPECIAL No. 261 westbound, and the THUNDERHAWK No. 262 eastbound.

These two freight trains maintain daily schedules that in some cases equal (in others surpass) passenger train schedules. In addition to these highballing freight trains, The Milwaukee Road continues to maintain its regular time freight service between Chicago and the north Pacific coast.

Typical of the speed of the XL SPECIAL and the THUNDER-HAWK is the daily schedule maintained by the westbound XL SPECIAL train No. 261, which leaves Chicago at 2:30 p.m. (late enough to permit connections with all eastern railroads' morning arrivals) and, in addition to its Chicago tonnage, makes pickups of cars in Milwaukee, the Twin Cities, and Aberdeen . . . and arrives in Spokane at 11:30 the second morning and Seattle-Tacoma the same evening.
