CHICAGO, Jan. 1.—Important changes were effected yesterday in the official staff in this city of the Erie and the Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul Roads.

H. W. Forward, who has been Division Freight Agent of the Erie system here for the past eight or ten years, was appointed Assistant General Freight Agent, with offices at Chicago.

Thomas Beard, who has been agent for the Erie Dispatch in this city, has been appointed Foreign Freight Agent for the same company, with headquarters in New York, succeeding C. P. Lamprey, who goes to Cleveland, with the title of General Manager of the Erie Dispatch; Mr. Lamprey succeeds George E. McKay.

W. E. Eden was appointed agent of the Erie Dispatch in Chicago to succeed Mr. Beard.

Padley, who has been Mr. Haughan's assistant.
