The rumor that the Chicago and North-western and Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul intend to acquire joint control of the property is not believed here, though it is probable that the Northwestern is interested in the deal. The Milwaukee and St. Paul could-have no object in acquiring the Great Western.
