TO BUY NO MORE LOCOMOTIVES.

Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul Road to Build Its Own Engines.

MILWAUKEE, April 27.—As a result of the official changes which will take place in the Chicago, Milwaukee and St. Paul Railroad on May 1, the company will very soon complete arrangements by which it will build all its locomotives at its shops in this city. In past years the Milwaukee Road has been annually purchasing a number of locomotives from the Baldwins, the New York builders, and other concerns. In future the company proposes to make its engines in Milwaukee under the general supervision of Vice President Barr, who is an expert mechanic and an inventor of some railway devices.

During the past two years nearly \$1,000,-000 has been expended by the road in improvements at its West Milwaukee plant. As a result of this outlay the company has here one of the most complete railway plants in the Northwest. The shops will be able to turn out from five to seven

locomotives a month.
