Bowman, Kilbourne, City. Two hundred and eighty-one thousand five hundred and fifty-two votes were cast. 'Ine old officers were re-elected.

ST. Louis, June 5 .- At the annual meeting of the stockholuers of the St. Louis, Alton and Terre Haute Railroad, which was held here to-day, the old Board of Directors was re-elected, with the exception that Eawin Abend takes the place of W.
